Finalised Marking Instructions

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General marking principles for National 5 Music

This information is provided to help you understand the general principles you must apply when marking candidate responses to questions in this Paper. These principles must be read in conjunction with the detailed marking instructions, which identify the key features required in candidate responses.

- (a) Marks for each candidate response must always be assigned in line with these general marking principles and the detailed marking instructions for this assessment.
- (b) Marking should always be positive. This means that, for each candidate response, marks are accumulated for the demonstration of relevant skills, knowledge and understanding: they are not deducted from a maximum on the basis of errors or omissions. Ignore additional answers in questions 7(a)(ii), 7(b)(ii) and 8.
- (c) Where a candidate has provided more than one answer, eg by ticking two boxes instead of one or adding an extra wrong answer, place a cross beside the wrong answer and deduct the mark assigned to the correct answer.
- (d) Do not accept any answer that is not in the marking instructions. Use professional judgement when candidates' responses do not exactly match marking instructions but carry the same meaning, eg pluck/plucked = plucking.
- (e) Candidates are asked to tick one or two boxes in multiple choice questions. Accept a cross or any other sign which makes the candidate's intentions clear.
- (f) Accept inaccurate spelling where the candidate's intention is clear.

8.				5	• Award 1 mark for each correct answer up to a maximum of 2 concepts per heading and up to a total of 5 marks. • Do not penalise the candidate if a concept appears to be in the wrong context eg: ○ The tempo is mf <i>or</i> ○ Melody/harmony - 4 beats in the bar • To achieve full marks, the candidate must comment on at least 3 headings: ○ Rhythm/tempo ○ Melody/harmony ○ Instruments ○ Dynamics • Answers can be in the form of bullet points or short answers or sentences or continuous prose and any of these are acceptable. • Accept inaccurate spelling of English or Italian terms where the candidate has made their intentions clear. • Long lists of concepts unrelated to the music and/or extensive lists of contradictory concepts will result in penalties being applied.
