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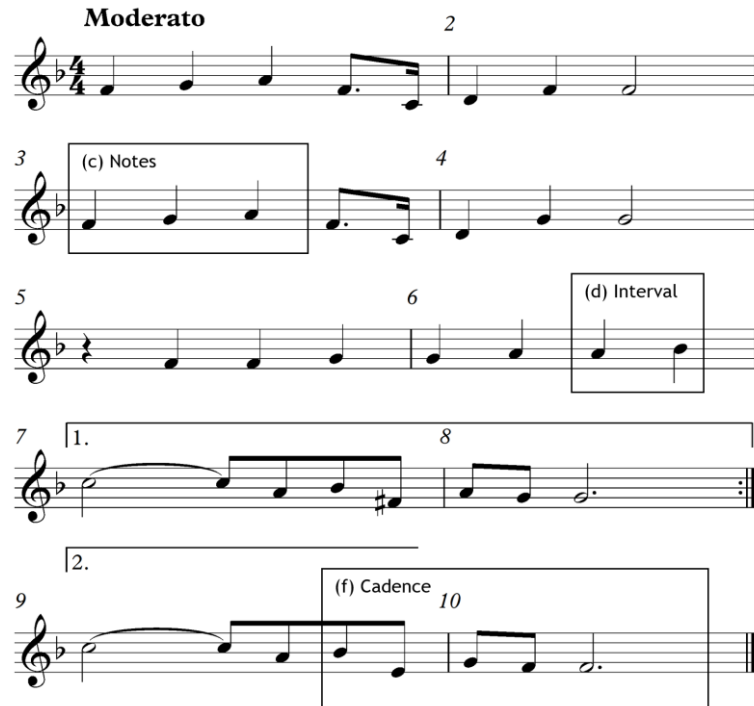


General marking principles for National 5 Music

Always apply these general principles. Use them in conjunction with the detailed marking instructions, which identify the key features required in candidates' responses.

- (a) Marking should always be positive. This means that, for each candidate response, marks are accumulated for the demonstration of relevant skills, knowledge and understanding: they are not deducted from a maximum on the basis of errors or omissions.
- (b) If a specific candidate response does not seem to be covered by either the principles or detailed marking instructions, and you are uncertain how to assess it, you must seek guidance from your team leader.
- (c) Marks for each candidate response must **always** be assigned in line with these general marking principles and the detailed marking instructions for this assessment.
- (d) Where a candidate has provided more than one answer, for example by ticking two boxes instead of one or adding an extra wrong answer, place a cross beside the wrong answer and do not award the mark assigned to the correct answer.
- (e) Do not accept any answer that is not in the marking instructions. Use professional judgement when candidates' responses do not exactly match marking instructions but carry the same meaning, for example pluck/plucked = plucking.
- (f) Candidates are asked to tick one or two boxes in multiple choice questions. Accept a cross or any other sign which makes the candidate's intentions clear.
- (g) Accept inaccurate spelling where the candidate's intention is clear.

		(ii)	The response must include vocals or lyrics or rhyming or words and beat or rhythm or music or accompaniment	1	Accept an answer that implies both vocals and music, for example: - speaking over a beat - there is singing over hip hop - talking in song – in this example, song is accepted as a second bullet point response as it implies a piece of music - lyrics with background singing – in this example background singing is accepted as a second bullet point response as background implies accompaniment. Do not accept answers such as: - the words are being sung quickly - in this example, the word ‘sung’ refers to the vocals and does not imply beat, rhythm, background music, or accompaniment. - it’s a person speaking while singing – in this example singing is not accepted as a second bullet point response because it does not imply beat, rhythm, music or accompaniment. Rap or rapping should not be credited. Disregard additional answers.

8.				5	• Award 1 mark for each correct answer up to a maximum of 2 concepts per heading and up to a total of 5 marks. • Do not penalise the candidate if a concept appears to be in the wrong context for example – the tempo is mf or – melody/harmony – 4 beats in the bar. • To achieve full marks, candidate must comment at least 3 headings – melody/harmony – rhythm/tempo – instruments – dynamics (Italian terms). • Answers can be in the form of bullet points or short answer or sentences or continuous prose and any of these are acceptable. • Long lists of concepts unrelated to the music and/or extensive lists of contradictory concepts will result in penalties being applied. • Accept inaccurate spelling of English or Italian terms where the candidate has made their intentions clear.
